Did You Know This About Charitable Contributions from IRA's? The Pension Protection Act of 2006 allowed taxpayers age 70½ and older to make tax-free charitable donations directly from their IRAs. By making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from an IRA directly to a qualified charitable organization, up to \$105,000 for 2024 and 108,000 for 2025 in contributions annually are excludable from gross income. These gifts, also known as "charitable IRA rollovers," would otherwise be taxable IRA distributions. This law has since been made permanent by the Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes Act of 2015. Taxpayers age 73 and older (70½ prior to 2020 and 72 prior to 2023) are required to take annual Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their retirement accounts. These RMDs are taxable. However, you can avoid this taxable income by making a QCD. This must be a direct transfer of funds from your IRA trustee to a qualified charity.
