

AS WE GATHER...Have you ever received a surprise present, one that was out of your own price range to get? That, in a nutshell, describes Epiphany. The Wise Men came to give presents, and instead received one their wealth could not have bought. We are included in this. We are baptized for the forgiveness of sins by His blood on the cross that covers our sins, once for all. That water and blood give us the greatest—and most expensive—gift in the world. 

Together, we provided Hearts of Mercy & Compassion hearts and crosses as symbols of hope, faith, and Christ's love to a grieving community.
















