FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

February 9, 2025



AS WE GATHER... Today we hear of Isaiah, who calls himself "a man of unclean lips." We read as Paul asks the rhetorical question, "What am I to do?" And we identify with Peter, who confesses, "I am a sinful man, O Lord." In short, we recognize that these people are just like us! But like all three, we have already been caught by our gracious God. Isaiah was called to write for God, Paul's pen brought the Gospel to the early church, and Peter led the disciples in spite of himself. With them, we have been caught in the "net," the good news of God's love and forgiveness. Today our worship is designed to move us outward, to fish for people who feel unclean, don't know what to do, and are leaderless; people who have not yet realized God's gracious love. Ready to go fishing?

Pastor: Isaiah cried, “I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips.”

People: We confess, Lord Jesus, that we have sinned in our speaking and doing and in our failures to speak or do; we deserve to have You depart from us.

Pastor: Despite their failures, Isaiah and Paul were inspired to write parts of the Bible and Peter led the disciples. By the grace of God, Jesus died and rose for you. As the angel told Isaiah, “Your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.” As a called and ordained servant of Christ, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen. Help us, Lord Jesus, to follow, calm and fearless, till our rest is won.

In our text, the Lord gives the directions to thresh the mountains and crush them. I wonder how long that will take? We can place our faith in the One who even crushed the mountain of sin in our lives through Jesus' death and resurrection.

EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER UPDATE

The ministry expansion project continues to make great progress. For the last month, the committees reported the following:

Building Committee:

- Exterior wall sheathing has been completed.
- Air and water barrier being applied.
- Roofing has been completed on the main roof.
- Interior framing has been completed and will be inspected by the Village.
- Electrical, Plumbing, HVAC and Sprinkler rough-ins in progress.



Next 30 days:

- Mechanical rough-ins will be completed and inspected.
- Insulation will be installed.
- Drywall will begin.
- Interior stairs will be installed.
- Exterior masonry will begin.

Finance Committee:

- Cumulatively to date, St. Paul has paid nearly \$2.4 towards the construction of the new building.
- At the end of January, St. Paul had more than \$1.7 million of funds on hand to satisfy upcoming construction costs for the next couple of months.
- More than \$1.6 million in promissory notes have been issued to date.
- Regarding any financing needed through Lutheran Church Extension Fund at the end of January, LCEF reported that all loan closing conditions have been addressed and satisfied. LCEF is preparing the final loan documents to be executed in February.
