AUTHENTIC RELATIONSHIPS

AS WE GATHER...It is difficult to have meaningful relationships with individuals from a distance, but many of us, aided by technology that spans the globe, pretend like it is not only possible, but preferable. Yet how much is lost relationally when we do not inhabit a shared space? Take a routine office meeting. Our world makes it very easy to have these meetings online. Yet, lost in the ease and efficiency of virtual meetings are the natural connections that come with a physical meeting. The greetings shared in the parking lot. The whispered comments and jokes that make the mundane affair much more bearable. The physical handshakes, pats on the back, and the close shoulder-to-shoulder proximity that reinforces the idea that you are not alone and that you are involved in something that extends beyond yourself.

When we were distant from God, Christ came near, becoming one with us in our flesh. Christ comes near again today, giving us His own body and blood to eat and to drink. Having embraced us with His incarnate love, Jesus now empowers us to draw near to one another and experience not distance, but authentic relationships.
