***“So then you are no longer strangers or aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone.” Ephesians 2:19-20***

When touring in Washington DC one of our stops is at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery. I thought I'd start this devotional thought by including excerpts from the four students who were our wreath bearers.

“The ultimate way to honor and thank all veterans, including the unidentified soldiers who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom, is the laying of the wreath ceremony.” - Armella

“We may never know their back stories or how they ended up in those battles. We might never know their true identities. But we know that they fought and that's enough to know they should always be honored.” – Evelyn

“The tomb stands as a reminder to never forget those who we might not know. A reminder of those who sacrificed their lives . . .” – Brodie

“It is important to never forget and continue to teach the younger generations about the sacrifices made by those who came before us to protect the freedoms we have today.” – Izzy

The words of these eighth graders really help us understand clearly what the Tomb of the Unknown represents. As I've been thinking about this devotion and how our day at Arlington focuses on soldiers and their service to our country, I've been drawn to a song. Many of you might know this song, 'Whom Shall I Fear', by Chris Tomlin. The chorus goes like this: "I know who goes before me, I know who stands behind, the God of Angel armies is always by my side. The one who reigns forever, He is a friend of mine, the God of Angel Armies is always by my side. . . . Whom shall I fear?"

Isn't this a magnificent picture? Our God is a God of angel armies. I picture all of God's angels under His direction, and they are surrounding me, keeping me safe. And what about us? We are part of God's army, we are His soldiers. As we fight our earthly battles, He never leaves our side. He knows each of us, we are NOT unknown to Him. He knows exactly who we are and what we need. Every day is a new battle. We battle on and He is always there. He is a friend of ours. The song goes onto say, "My strength is in your name, for you alone can save. You will deliver me. Whom shall I fear?" In Exodus 14:14 it says, "The Lord will fight for you, you need only to be still." What comforting words to hear! Our God is always there, fighting for us. When you think He is not, be still. Wait for Him.

In closing, I have a few encouraging thoughts about our God, the God of Angel Armies.

- The eyes of the Lord are on us at all times. He sees everything! We are never beyond His care.
- The Spirit of God is in all places, at all times. He knows everywhere we go, everything we do and is intimately acquainted with all our ways.
- Jesus, our Good Shepherd, knows ALL His sheep and loses none.
- He is attentive to the needs of the birds of the air and lilies of the field. His presence and provision for us is constant.
