

The Very Hungry Caterpillar

Eric Carle's story begins with, "One Sunday morning the warm sun came up and pop! Out of the egg came a tiny and very hungry caterpillar." Just like this caterpillar, God created you for a purpose. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful. I know that full well. Psalm 139:14.

But life wasn't always easy for the caterpillar. He had to be careful of predators like spiders, wasps and one time a bird even tried to eat him, but he camouflaged himself on a leaf. Caterpillars may make use of camouflage to evade their predators, but very few eggs and caterpillars survive. Like that caterpillar, there is a predator in our life that tries to stop us from living the life for which we are created. The predator we face is Satan. You may think that you are destined to crawl around and eat whatever the world throws at you, trying to avoid sin and death, thinking that there's nothing you can do about your life and you're right! We can't do anything to save ourselves, . . . but God can and did.

When we trust in Christ, something new is activated from within. Our old life is gone, but in His hands, we are made new. We are a new creation. The story of the cocoon and chrysalis reminds us that on Sunday morning after Jesus had been crucified and taken to the



grave, the disciples came to the tomb and saw Jesus' graveclothes lying there, much like an empty chrysalis. An angel told the startled disciples, "He is risen." The very hungry caterpillar changed into a very beautiful butterfly. With Christ in our life, we too can be transformed, by grace, to live a beautiful life here on Earth and to look forward to eternal life with Him in heaven.

MINISTRY EXPANSION BUILDING PROJECT - PROMISSORY NOTES

A promissory note is similar to a traditional mortgage or loan agreement, but it is quite a bit simpler. It is a financial instrument that contains a written promise by one party (the borrower or issuer) to pay another party (the noteholder or payee) a definite sum of money, either on demand or at a specified future date. St. Paul would be the borrower and you would be the noteholder.
