"In Christ you also are being built up together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit." Ephesians 2:22

During the past few weeks, my sister-in-law, niece, and I have been packing up my mom's apartment, and through that process, we couldn't help but notice what she cherished. We found files of teaching materials, handmade Mother's Day cards, a Betty Crocker Cookbook from 1965 -- including notes on many of the recipes, numerous family pictures, and Christmas ornaments that contained all the baby and school pictures of each of her grandchildren. In the Christmas boxes, we found the Chrismon ornaments she had made with the ladies' group and six different nativity sets, ranging from one made out of candles, another as a souvenir from Alaska -- yes, of black bears, and one of olive wood from Israel. She had begun an Ecclesiastical Embroidery group in Truman, Minnesota, where I'd lived when I was in first through fourth grades, and she'd kept the patterns ever since. We also found her wedding hymnal, TLH of course, with the black leatherette cover and her name embossed in gold letters. There were devotional books with pages folded over and many with handwritten notes. Bibles were in each of the rooms in her apartment and several more on a bookshelf in her bedroom -- Gideon New Testaments; one of just the Gospel of John; RSV, NIV, and ESV translations; one in German; and two in carrying cases, one for the Bible study she led at Village Pointe and the other for the Bible studies she attended at her church. Several Bible study guides held her notes, and I found prayer journals that she had kept throughout the years, finding how often she sought forgiveness, how often she prayed for her children and grandchildren, and how daily she prayed for those who didn't know Jesus.

I could say that all of these things represent what is most important to my mom, but at a recent visit with her, she said, "I think there's a purpose for me here right now. Even though I can't remember my words really well -- I have to rehearse them a few times before they come out -- I can still use what I have to show people Jesus."

Her words hit my heart, and they become my prayer -that none of us is defined by the things that surround us, even the things we cherish, but that we are filled by our purpose: we can show people Jesus.


VEGGIES & ICE CREAM




