Luke 6 | Peace on the Mountain

There's something serene about a mountain. It's quiet, beautiful, and it's a place you can think and clear your head. Jesus must have felt the same way about them. He tended to go into the mountains often when He wanted time alone to pray. Which is exactly what was happening in Luke chapter 6. Jesus was at the beginning of His ministry. He had begun healing and was starting to teach and paint a picture of what it looks like to follow Him. And then we find Him in verse 12, "one of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray and spent the night praying to God" (NIV). Before teaching, healing, and decisions, He was in the quiet, praying. What happened next was significant. He came down from the mountain and chose His apostles. The men who would build His church and ultimately spread the Gospel throughout the world were chosen after this night in prayer.

Quiet, uninterrupted time with God gave Jesus wisdom, guidance, and peace. He left that night of prayer ready to make substantial decisions that would leave a lasting impact on the world. Vines Dictionary shows that the phrase "to continue" [all night in prayer] is in other places in Scripture too. It's interpreted as "to abide together, abide with."

One definition of abide is to remain stable or fixed in a state. So Jesus remained in a state of prayer all night long. German pastor, George Muller, lived by this. He showed everyone what it looked like to continue or abide in a state of prayer. Mueller said, "I live in the spirit of prayer. I pray as I walk about, when I lie down and when I rise up. And the answers are always coming." Living in a spirit of prayer leaves the prayer line open, never really finishing with an amen, but instead, continuously meditating on Him, breathing in and out prayers all day long, praying verses as He brings them to mind, praising, and worshipping Him. And when our hearts are heavy, there's a decision to be made, or we're just weary, we need to "go to the mountainside" and pour out our hearts to Him. The more we're in communion with Him, the more He is able to minister to us, leading and guiding us where He wants us to be and ultimately bringing us peace.

Two thousand years ago, Jesus came to bring peace to our broken world. As we celebrate His birth this season, let's remember we're not only celebrating what happened then and what's to come later, we're also celebrating what resides in us now. His name is Peace and He lives within.

REFLECTION In this season of busyness, where is my mountainside, my place of quiet with God? How can I remain in a spirit of prayer?

PRAYER Father, I come to you in this quiet place, laying all of my worries, fears and questions at your feet. Would you fill me with your wisdom, strength and unwavering Peace? Thank you, Lord, for all you are doing in me. In Jesus' name. Amen.



Our ministry expansion project continues to make great progress. In the last month, the committees reported the following:

Building Committee:

- All new utility connections have been completed in Washington St.
- Landscape restoration has been completed east of the gym and out to Washington St.
- Steel structure erection has been completed.

During the next 30 days

- Second floor slab will be poured with provisions for the weather.
- Exterior wall framing will progress throughout the month.
- Window framing and blocking will also progress with wall framing.

EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER

Finance Committee:

- Cumulatively to date, St. Paul has paid nearly \$1.3 million toward the construction of the new building to its
 architect and general contractor.
- Over \$1.3 million in promissory notes have been issued by St. Paul to date. For those that remain interested, we are continuing to issue promissory notes. Please reach out to the Finance Office to learn more.
- Lutheran Church Extension Fund is finalizing their review of St. Paul loan application in December.
- At the end of November, St. Paul had over \$1.9 million of funds on hand to satisfy construction costs for the next several months. Current projections suggest we may need to begin borrowing from an external lender beginning in February 2025.






Fire and Faithfulness by Sadie Robertson Huff (youth)
