Searching for Wisdom

Last week, my students had the opportunity to review the Bible story of the Calling of Matthew. After reading it, rereading it, talking through it, and working through what it means to completely and blindly trust Jesus, we had Pastor Schultz come in. He talked more about this concept and helped us relate our callings in the here and now.

Pastor Schultz gave us three questions to ask ourselves as we listen to the voice of Jesus amidst decisions big and small.

- 1. What gifts has God given you?
- 2. What are the needs of those around you? (and how do your gifts support/help)
- 3. Make a decision (prayerfully) and don't look back (trust God to see you through).

"Proverbs 19:8 Whoever gets sense loves his own soul; he who keeps understanding will discover good."

We might think of wisdom as something that comes naturally from some people, or maybe it comes with cumulative experience over time. Both could be true, certainly. However, Scripture also says that wisdom is something we can go and get from The Word and through prayer! When we ask God for wisdom, He is ready to give it. It is a good challenge for us to learn and actively pursue ways of knowing how to make good decisions with the help of God's Word and prayer.

Trust God with your life; He will not fail you. He has equipped you, sends Godly support to encourage and pray for you, and He will see you through the decision. Don't look back! Look at Jesus and lean into His goodness.



EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER UPDATE

The ministry expansion project continues to make great progress. For the last month, the committees reported the following:



EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER

Building Committee:

- Exterior wall sheathing has been completed.
- Air and water barrier being applied.
- Roofing has been completed on the main roof.
- Interior framing has been completed and will be inspected by the Village.
- Electrical, Plumbing, HVAC and Sprinkler rough-ins in progress.

Next 30 days:

- Mechanical rough-ins will be completed and inspected.
- Insulation will be installed.
- Drywall will begin.
- Interior stairs will be installed.
- Exterior masonry will begin.

Finance Committee:

- Cumulatively to date, St. Paul has paid nearly \$2.4 towards the construction of the new building.
- At the end of January, St. Paul had more than \$1.7 million of funds on hand to satisfy upcoming construction costs for the next couple of months.
- More than \$1.6 million in promissory notes have been issued to date.
- Regarding any financing needed through Lutheran Church Extension Fund at the end of January, LCEF reported that all loan closing conditions have been addressed and satisfied. LCEF is preparing the final Loan documents to be executed in February.






