"In Christ you also are being built up together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit." Ephesians 2:22

I am on my third journey reading through the Bible. I grew up in a faithful family, went to church and Sunday School but each time I read some of these Bible stories, I am amazed at the new things God is teaching me through His Word!

I was starting to wonder about my journey in this life. Am I like the Israelites? Is my complaining heard more than my thanksgiving and gratefulness? My New Year's Resolution was to keep a GRATEFUL Journal. Each night, I sit and reflect on how God showed Himself that day. I can't believe all the things that God has shown me! Beautiful sunrises and sunsets, a bed to sleep on, little people that give me hugs each morning, a smile from someone as I walk down the hall, loving family and friends, a funny story, cars that work, warm houses, exercise, time outside, plenty of food, challenges that help me grow, my dishwasher - I could go on and on. Then there are the BIG things - forgiveness of my sins, God's Word that speaks to me and LIFE EVERLASTING!

Paul calls us to do everything without grumbling and complaining (Philippians 2:14). He says: "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances. for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 5:16 -18). "Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His love endures forever" (Psalm 106:1).

I think in this New Year, I'm learning to open my eyes to the challenges as God's hugs. He is pulling me closer to Himself as I learn to trust and grow closer to Him. I pray that you will take that journey with me. Start a grateful journal and jot down some things today that God has blessed you with! Trust Him to bring you closer through His Word.




<u>Accepting Endowment Fund Grant</u> Applications - Fiscal Year 2025-2026

EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER UPDATE

The ministry expansion project continues to make great progress. For the last month, the committees reported the following:



EVERY GENERATION FAITHFUL TOGETHER

Building Committee:

- Exterior wall sheathing has been completed.
- Air and water barrier being applied.
- Roofing has been completed on the main roof.
- Interior framing has been completed and will be inspected by the Village.
- Electrical, Plumbing, HVAC and Sprinkler rough-ins in progress.

Next 30 days:

- Mechanical rough-ins will be completed and inspected.
- Insulation will be installed.
- Drywall will begin.
- Interior stairs will be installed.
- Exterior masonry will begin.

Finance Committee:

- Cumulatively to date, St. Paul has paid nearly \$2.4 towards the construction of the new building.
- At the end of January, St. Paul had more than \$1.7 million of funds on hand to satisfy upcoming construction costs for the next couple of months.
- More than \$1.6 million in promissory notes have been issued to date.
- Regarding any financing needed through Lutheran Church Extension Fund at the end of January, LCEF reported that all loan closing conditions have been addressed and satisfied. LCEF is preparing the final Loan documents to be executed in February.






