## **Finding Joy and Peace in All Circumstances**

*"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again:  
Rejoice!" — Philippians 4:4*

Show your children that true joy doesn't come from what happens around us but from knowing that we are loved and held by a faithful God.

No matter what today brings, may we rest in the promise that God is with us. May we rejoice in His goodness, finding peace in His unchanging love.

My prayer for you, today and always:

*Heavenly Father, I thank you that you are a God who is faithful and loving. I thank you for always listening to our prayers, and for being our constant source of joy and peace. Help our school families to trust You in all circumstances, knowing that You will work all things together for your good. Fill our hearts, school, and homes with Your presence so that we may experience your peace and rejoice in You, always. Amen.*
