Finding Joy and Peace in All Circumstances

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" — Philippians 4:4

Life is certainly full of ups and downs. Some days are filled with laughter and ease, while others bring challenges that can weigh us down. As followers of Christ, we can find comfort in the fact that our joy and peace are not dependent on our circumstances—they are found in God alone.

Paul wrote the words of Philippians 4:4 while in prison. It's hard to imagine being imprisoned for proclaiming God's word, and still having an attitude of joy. Even in hardship, he encouraged believers to rejoice—not because life was easy, but because God's presence is constant. When we trust in Him, we can have a deep, unshakable peace, even in the midst of uncertainty.

Here is my challenge for you: actively work to praise God in both celebrations and struggles. Model praying with your family in difficult moments and thanking Him for His blessings, big and small. Show your children that true joy doesn't come from what happens around us but from knowing that we are loved and held by a faithful God.

No matter what today brings, may we rest in the promise that God is with us. May we rejoice in His goodness, finding peace in His unchanging love.

My prayer for you, today and always:

Heavenly Father, I thank you that you are a God who is faithful and loving. I thank you for always listening to our prayers, and for being our constant source of joy and peace. Help our school families to trust You in all circumstances, knowing that You will work all things together for your good. Fill our hearts, school, and homes with Your presence so that we may experience your peace and rejoice in You, always. Amen.






